Dear Friends in Christ,

The closing devotion in the devotion booklet for this year's Lenten/Easter midweek series, "Thy Will Be Done," makes this statement: "After the darkness of Good Friday, Jesus rose to life that is full of light and life and hope. The tomb was defeated. New life reigned. That new life is also ours. . . . Yet in spite of the Easter Good news, we learn that life continues to be filled with tombs . . . with endings . . . and darkness . . . and covering stones. Of course, we are Easter People. But we do not deny the reality of tombs or the reality of the tears or pain."

How true this is. Easter gives us hope for eternity, but it doesn't take away temporal suffering and pain. Even after Jesus resurrection the pain and suffering of sin continues in this life. . . . but with the hope of relief in the life to come.

So the devotion goes on to say; "Listen with the ears of faith. Do you hear it? Surely the sound is there, as the resurrection message itself. The stone is still rolling. Hear it? We believe that every ending is a new beginning, every tomb is subject to being ripped open, every human dilemma, every ending created by human sin or frailty or human foolishness can be torn open to the light and become the very place of a new beginning, a new life. That's the life of resurrection brought for us by Jesus Christ. Death and Satan can no longer hold us. We are free to shout the good news from the housetops. Christ is risen indeed."

FINANCES God Bless all who are able to give! We made a deposit of \$6,833.44 on March 19th. Of that, \$5,377.00 was for current. Our end of month expenses are still large due to the fuel bill (Good news- there is only one left due at the end of April!). With that said, we are still struggling, as you can see by the number below. As of February, when looking at the actual budget, we are still behind by \$14,000. By God's grace, we will get through.

PARSONAGE ROOF Can you hear the drip-drop of water in a bucket during a rain storm? Neither can Pastor or his family...for now. The parsonage roof is in desperate need of replacement this year. The Mission and Ministry Team (MMT)- formerly called the Church Council, has been working on this concern. They are ready to contract a roofer to complete this project. The cost will be around \$13,000. We have around \$4,000 saved in the project fund. We'll have to borrow the rest... unless we can raise the remaining amount by June of this year. If you can spare a little extra, please designate it to the project fund.

St. Mark Endowment Fund

The St. Mark Endowment Fund was established in the year 2001 with a donation made by the Sturm Family. The original amount was \$150,000. There was always hopes of adding contributions to our fund to help it grow, but the hopes just didn't quite become a reality. Even without many contributions and taking a portion of the interest for various projects each year, the fund has since grown to be over \$160,000.

Annually, our church is required to take out the interest from our fund in the form of a check. Over the past few years, we have received the interest and it has been over \$7,000. We have done many different things with this interest. We have done projects such as the church roof, updating the kitchen, and replacing the church windows just to name a few. The money was originally set up to be used for special projects or ministries and not for general expenses (if we could help it).

We've since formed a committee to help promote and rejuvenate our fund.

What is an Endowment Fund? **An endowment fund is a permanent, self-sustaining source of funding.** Endowment assets are invested. Each year, a portion of the value of the fund is paid out to support the fund's purpose, and any earnings more than this distribution are used to build the fund's market value.

How can I give to the fund?

Designate your offering by noting "Endowment Fund" on either your offering envelope or a pew envelope. The contributions that come in help to raise the invested amount, thus creating more interest to be earned at the end of the year.

You may also consider the Endowment Fund as a part of your estate planning.

The St. Mark Endowment Fund continues giving into the future and allows a thoughtful steward to leave just a contribution or even a gift in their estate to support beloved ministries.


