Dear Friends in Christ,

In February we celebrate St. Valentine's Day. . . a day to celebrate love.

I recently read a devotion that reminded me of the importance of telling those we love that we love then. The devotion talked about Scott Kologi who murdered his parents, his sister, and a 70-year-old family friend this past New Year's Eve.

One of the survivors of the family catastrophe is Scott's older brother, Steven Kologi, Jr. Understandably, Steven has been devastated by his loss and he, like many in his age group, turned to Facebook to share his feelings. Some of his thoughts were memories of past good times with the entire family, which will never come again.

Here are a few things that Steven has said:

- (Mom and dad were) "the greatest parents I could ask for."
- "They made sure Christmas came every year although they struggled financially. I cannot even describe the type of people they were, so just believe me when I say how great they were."
- "Never once was I without a hot meal or a roof over my head."

But there's more. Steven has reached into himself and done some serious self-evaluating. He has spoken freely of his regrets. It is those regrets that we should pay attention to. For example, he said, "I just wish I could tell all of them how much they meant to me and how much I truly loved each and every one of them because I didn't do that enough."

That seems to be a theme in Steven's writings. At the end of one Facebook sharing, he encouraged people "to give the ones you love an extra kiss or 'I love you."

How often have we heard mourning families speak of how they had intended to say, "I love you" to a loved one who had passed away, but never got around to it; or it just didn't seem the right time; or they weren't sure how it would be received; or they hadn't yet made peace over an old conflict, or

There are hundreds of reasons not to say, "I love you."

I can think of at least four reasons to share your heart's feelings with those who are or should be special:

1. We who are recipients of the Lord's love, forgiveness, and salvation have a wonderful opportunity to share that love with others. You remember, "We love because He first loved us" (1 John 4:19).

2. We do it because we need to say it.

3. We do it because they need to hear it.

4. We do it because we never know when the last opportunity to say those words may come.

As Steven said, "And please, please, please remember to give the ones you love an extra kiss or 'I love you."

STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE

As of year-end, we carried over \$9,000 in our checking account into the new year. By God's grace and all who were able to give, we covered all our expenses in the previous year. In summer, we did borrow from our savings account to carry us through. We are back to our original savings balance of over \$5,000.

Bear in mind, however, that our church does carry a budget. Our budget for the 2018 year totals \$172,924.96. Divided out over the year, this equates to approximately \$14,500 **per month** that is needed to cover budgeted expenses. This is to come from our offering envelopes. Please keep this number in mind as you plan your offerings.

We made a deposit of \$15,130.99 on January 22nd. Of that, \$6,387.37 was for current- This included our 4th quarter shared expenses from St. Luke of \$2,346.77. Yes, there is a negative balance showing below, but our end of January expenses are covered. I thought it may have been a trying month, with heating fuel and repair costs, but we are holding our own yet.
