Dear friends in Christ,

I like to share one of the *Key For Kids* devotional messages that I use when leading a chapel service at St. Paul's school in Manawa. I also use them in my sermons here at St. Mark and St Luke. I like them because they are simple and make a good point for all ages. Here is one that I thought would make a good newsletter article this month. It was written by Linda E. Knight:

Endangered Souls

Theo carefully hung a poster on his bedroom wall. He stepped back to look at it. "EXTINCTION IS FOREVER! SAVE YOUR PLANET NOW!" it said, the large letters looming out at him. Then he ran down the stairs, two steps at a time.

"Whoa, Theo! Slow down! Where are you going, and what do you have in that box?" asked Dad.

"These are the calendars we're selling for our school project," replied Theo. "Each month has a picture of an endangered animal. The money we make is going to help with research on ways people can take better care of the earth. Lots of animals and plants are already extinct--they don't exist anymore. We want to keep that from happening to more." He opened the box. "How many do you want?" he asked eagerly.

"I'll take two," said Dad. He smiled. "I'm proud of you, Theo. It's important to take good care of the earth God has given us." Then he sighed. "Though it's too bad we often forget what's in the greatest danger of all."

"What are you talking about?" asked Theo. "The rainforests?"

Dad shook his head. "I wasn't thinking of animals or the environment. I was thinking of people's souls. Anyone who dies rejecting Jesus will experience something much worse than extinction--they'll face eternal punishment in hell. It's good to be concerned about saving the earth, but we should be even more concerned about saving people."

"I never thought about that," said Theo. He frowned. "But I can't make people become Christians!"

"No," said Dad. "But think about your earth project, Theo--are you able to keep people from doing things that destroy the earth?"

"Well, no," said Theo. "But I can raise awareness about what's happening to the earth, so they know about it. Then hopefully they'll decide to change."

"Right," said Dad. "And that's what we need to do for people who don't know Jesus. We can't make them become Christians, but we can tell them what Jesus did for them, pray for them, and show them God's love through our actions. Then hopefully they'll recognize they need Jesus too."

Now I fully agree that we should be concerned about our planet. Everyone needs to do their part to take care of God's creation. But what about the people you know who don't know Jesus—are you concerned about their souls? Humans are God's greatest creation, and Jesus became human Himself to take the punishment for our sins on the cross so we could be saved. Trust Him to help you share the good news of His love with others.

This gospel message is so important. God has entrusted that message to us as individuals and he has entrusted that message to the Church.

This is why our congregations in Symco and Big Falls need to keep working hard to keep moving forward . . Our communities need us. Our communities need somewhere that we can provide a place where people can come and worship and learn and serve. Our communities need a place that shares God's Love and they need a place that cares as much about the endangered souls of the people around us and their place in heaven as it concerned about endangered animals' lives in this temporary world.

If you are reading this article, you are a member of St Luke or St, Mark. If not, you are at least supportive of the ministry we provide. We need our members to put a greater effort to make sure our congregations don't become "extinct". We need people to give of their Time – Talent – and Treasure.

We have a lot of very active members of both congregations who give a lot and make the sacrifices necessary to keep our churches going. But they are getting tired. We really need some of those less active members to step up and do what they can as well.

I think we will be amazed what a difference it will make when all our members put a greater effort to save our church from extinction.

\$TEWARDSHIP & FINANCE\$

As summer is turning to fall, hopefully some of our families will return to church regularly and continue to give. We made a deposit of \$9,165.00 on August 6, 2024. Of that, \$7,975.00 went to current. There were some kind offerings, which will hopefully help to pull us through August without withdrawing from our savings account. Please keep this in mind as you give your offerings.

Checkbook Balance (as of 8/7/2024): \$1,903.78

Monies to deposit for designating (memorials/fundraisers): \$0.

Upcoming Expenses: \$7,571.76 Missions Collected: \$265 (so far) Youth Collected: \$0 YTD Endowment Fund Collected: \$0 Project Fund Collected: \$25.00 (so far)

Ending balance: - \$5,957.98 (This is what is needed currently for our August expenses)

Savings Account Balance (8/19/24): \$13,034.65 (for reference, it was \$29,000 when we began in 2024).

If you're unable to attend church in person, consider mailing in your offering envelope. Or, put your offerings on "auto pilot"- we use Vanco for our electronic giving. You can choose to do a recurring amount or just give as you are able (either by text on your mobile phone or from your PC/laptop). If you need help with this, call the church office and we'd be happy to walk you through the process.

STILL SEEKING... CHURCH TREASURER St. Mark needs a church treasurer!

Some time ago, we put the Treasurer position, the church secretary position, and the Congregational (Council) Secretary positions all together as one position.

The time has come to reevaluate that decision. It may be better to separate the Treasurer' position and the church secretary position as it had been in the past. Tracy Heideman, who currently serves this position, would agree. She is willing to continue as our church secretary but would like us to find someone who would take on the Treasurer' duties.



Primary Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Be the Chief Financial Officer of the congregation and shall be responsible for the overall financial program of the congregation in accordance with policies approved by the church council and Voters' assembly.
- 2. Be responsible for the safekeeping of all funds, securities, and fiduciary documents of the congregation.
- 3. Be the disbursing agent of the congregation. All checks shall be issued under the authority and supervision of the treasurer, who shall be responsible for the establishment of appropriate fiscal controls over the congregation.
- 4. Serve as the controller of the congregation and be responsible for the financial accounting system, the preparation of financial statements and the periodic reporting of them to the congregation, and the establishment or review of all financial accounting procedures. All accounting procedures are subject to the approval of the church council.

In the past, this was an elected position and the person assuming the responsibility was paid a salary for their time. Contact the church office for more information.
